3. REPORT BY LEO LA FRANCE	Leo reported on the following topics			
	 Intensive English program in the French schools: A meeting of the comité de suivi is scheduled for December 5. In addition a committee has also been struck to study how this will impact the English sector, and to look at how partnerships can be created. 			
	 Report Cards: Leo confirmed having received feedback from individual school boards on the technical aspects and availability of the report card, which he appreciates as it allows him to keep MELS updated with current concerns. A round table discussion was had and members shared their concerns. Marian Lothian asked if LCEEQ should prepare a position paper and the consensus was positive. Members agreed to forward their written comments for a paper to be drafted prior to the holidays. 			
	 Meeting in Quebec City: At the ADIGECS congress on November 16 the MELS met with all the Directors General of the youth sector for a work session that focused on the economic pressures facing Quebec, and thus, all government-funded services over the short-term horizon. The projections with respect to the next budget indicate substantial challenges ahead for public education. 			
	Publishers: DSCA will continue working on getting some online materials for the English sector. At the moment the French sector has a website allowing teacher access to online materials.			
	 Community Learning Centers: Fourteen new CLCs have been approved. The CLCs are funded by the Canada-Quebec entente and by the school boards on a declining basis over a seven year period.

	 Special Needs: A survey has been sent to all school Principals on collecting information for "les projets pédagogiques particuliers" and identifying how many students with special needs are integrated into these programs. In order to facilitate the participation of English speakers, DSCA provided a courtesy translation in the form of a PDF document. Aboriginal Panel: A panel has been set up to identify needs of the aboriginal people and it will be making recommendations to Prime Minister Harper. The decisions could have some impact on some of our English school boards. Rencontre Nationale: Jill reported that the next rencontre will be held on December 13 and 14, 2011. Members were asked to forward their feedback via their Directors General to the question of what kind of participation would the English sector like to have given the theme will be on the intensive English program. Entente Canada-Quebec: Negotiations have already begun for the next Entente. The current one ends on June 2013. Plan Nord-meeting with Jean Charest: At the last meeting Premier Charest was present. The two main topics were how to best manage the funding from both the government and the various companies involved; and managing the mining industry where enormous advancements are expected.
